Here in Haiti's Central Plateau



daily life is a constant struggle to survive.



Food is scarce



and people have no means of refrigeration.



Charcoal is commonly used for cooking.



Cooking with charcoal presents many serious problems. Charcoal is inefficient, expensive, very harmful to the environment and poses a serious health hazard.



In this region there is no electricity



The scarcity and access to clean water is a daily



problem for families living in the Central Plateau.



When the rainy season begins



daily life becomes even more difficult.



Typically in this region houses have dirt floors.



So when it rains, the dirt floors turn to mud.



During the rainy season daily life is a constant struggle.
